A highlight of the evening was a <u>Made in Owosso</u> exhibit which included of one of the very first iron chairs produced by Woodard, circa 1934.

Kicking off the Saturday, July 30 festivities was Rich Snyder who sang the National Anthem. Aiding in the celebration were Michigan dignitaries who presented proclamations to Woodard. Owosso Mayor Ben Frederick, commented that Woodard workers were as strong as the furniture that they made. Danny Miller, Owosso Charter Township Supervisor, added that Woodard is the inspiration of talented people and an example of the American dream.
